From Wales to Warsaw





- Decision to establish 6 NFIUs at the Eastern flank of the Alliance was adopted in the NATO Wales Summit in September, 2014
- Aim to adopt to the current security situation and reinforce NATO's collective defence





Status

- International Military HQ since 1 SEP 2015
 - In accordance to the Paris Protocol (1952)
 - A part of NATO Force Structure
- First NATO HQ in Latvia
 - Permanent NATO presence
 - Part of Readiness Action Plan

Enhanced Forward Presence (eFP)



- "NATO Defence Ministers agreed on an enhanced forward presence in the eastern part of our Alliance," Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg said.
- The enhanced forward presence will be "multinational, to make clear that an attack against one Ally is an attack against all Allies, and that the Alliance as a whole will respond"



Role of NFIU LVA




- Permanent NATO presence in Latvia



Transatlantic Capability Enhancement and Training (TACET) Initiative "Common Training - Improved Interoperability -Enhanced Capabilities and Resilience - Credible Assurance"

Press Release - 10 February 2016 Defence Ministerial

Today, the Minister of Defence of the Federal Republic of Germany, the Secretary of Defense of the United States of America and the Secretary of State for Defence of the United Kingdom gathered with the Ministers of Defence of Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Estonia, France, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Norway and Poland, providing a visible sign of common efforts through the joint implementatio of the Transatlantic Capability Enhancement and Training (TACET) initiative

TACET supports the implementation of the Assurance Measures of the NATO Readiness Action Plan (RAP with a focus on coordination and sustainability. TACET will enhance interoperability between Allied forces. Moreover, the initiative will facilitate and enhance capability development of the respective Host Nations -Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania and Poland – with an emphasis on capabilities related to collective defence and

The aforementioned Allies support the TACET short to mid-term training objectives of Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania and Poland, e.g. through the provision of subject matter expertise in agreed priority capability areas such as military engineering and medical support; participation in NATO and multinational exercises in the region and through utilizing rotating persistent presence forces.

The Multinational Corps Northeast Headquarters in Szczecin, supported by the recently-established NATO Force Integration Units in Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, and Poland, will play a central role in the coordination and facilitation of the TACET objectives and its various activities in the respective countries

Those TACET objectives to be implemented by the Warsaw Summit 2016 will provide a tangible contribution to the full implementation of the NATOReadiness Action Plan



Enhanced Forward Presence Battle Group in LVA



- BG will have Canadian Framework with at least 4 other participating Sending Nations
- At least a 450 strong 6 monthly rotational force with a number of other additional supporting elements
- Trained and equipped for Defensive Ops
- Defensive capabilities will complement the LVA National Armed Forces and other NATO high readiness forces such as the VJTF
- Clear commitment to security of LVA
- Major part will be based at Adazi but some elements may be located elsewhere
- Adazi will be a key training area for all eFP BGs
- Further development of maintenance, warehousing and welfare facilities
- Further development of transport and staging infrastructure will be necessary
- NFIU will facilitate CAN BG deployment, sustainment and exercises2
